## **POLICE REPORT**

**PURCELLVILLE, Va. June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2015 —**

06/13/2015 – 3:16 a.m. 700 Blk. E. Main St. **Aggravated Assault**

Police were called to the scene of an assault. The victim had suffered injuries that were not deemed to be too serious. Investigation determined that two groups of individuals had been involved in a verbal argument at a bar outside of town and had met up in a parking lot of a business in town. At that time, the victim was assaulted by a subject. The offender has been identified but the victim is reluctant to pursue charges at this time. The investigation is continuing.

Police were called to the scene of a person that was feeling suicidal. A C.I.T. trained police officer was able to convince the person to seek help and assisted with transportation to a mental health facility for treatment.

Family members were involved in a domestic dispute and property had been damaged. The parties calmed down on police arrival and the person who had damaged the property agreed to make restitution in reference to the damaged item. No further police action requested.

Police were called to the scene to meet an individual who allegedly had made suicidal thoughts. He was calm prior to police leaving and stated that he would call if he needed assistance.
