COMPREHENSIVE PLAN RESPONSE DEADLINE EXTENDED TO MARCH 4th

**TOWN TO HOST TABLE AT LOUDOUN GROWN EXPO
SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 27th – 10:00 AM TO 5:00 PM**

PURCELLVILLE, Va. February 24, 2016 — The Town of Purcellville will be hosting a table at the Loudoun Grown Expo this Saturday, February 27, 2016 from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM where Town staff will be talking about the comprehensive plan update and handing out printed copies of the initial public exercises. In order to ensure Expo attendees and other members of the public have adequate time to submit their responses to these exercises, the response deadline has been extended to March 4th.

“We are trying to notify everyone in town that the comprehensive plan is being updated and to encourage responses to the public exercises,” said Senior Planner Daniel Galindo. “A table at the Loudoun Grown Expo provides us with a great opportunity to reach people that might not commonly follow planning issues in Purcellville and may not yet be aware of the comprehensive plan update.”

The first is an online survey which asks what is important about Purcellville. The second is a mapping exercise which asks what areas in and around Purcellville should be preserved, developed or redeveloped; the mapping exercise must be printed and returned to Town Hall (221 South Nursery Avenue, Purcellville, Virginia 20132) in order for the response to be received.

Purcellville is an award-winning town of nearly 8,300 residents located in Loudoun County, approximately 40 miles west of Washington, DC.
