02/27/2016 12:38am – W.T. Druhan Jr. Blvd/South Maple Ave **DUI**

A police officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation. It was determined that the driver, Kimberly Cummings a 49 year old female of Harpers Ferry, WV, was intoxicated and arrested for DUI.

02/28/2016 2:23pm – 1000 Block of E. Main Street **Credit Card Fraud**

Police responded to a business for a report of a larceny. Upon arrival police were notified a male suspect entered the store and attempted to purchase a gift card with several credit cards. The suspect became suspicious of the clerk and fled the scene. Investigation continues.
